

Storm Water Training at Wildflower on September 6th

Storm water compliance training will be held on Thursday, September 6th at <u>Wildflower Country Club</u> in Temple from 11am to 2 pm. Lunch will be included in the cost of the seminar, which is \$25 for TABA members and \$35 for nonmembers.

Training will be geared to reflect the collaboration of Texas Association of Builders, the EPA and the TCEQ in developing a sensible approach to protecting our environment while ensuring that the fine meets the crime.

The seminar will include an overview of the Municipal Storm Water Program, a SWP3 permit summary, a TCEQ checklist worksheet, information about noted problems at Texas construction sites, information about best management practices, and more.

As you might recall from past reports, TABA has been working with the City of Temple in the development of their municipal storm water program and associated best management practices. Special guest, Temple City Engineer Michael Newman will be invited to brief the audience on the status of Temple's MS4 program at the beginning of the meeting. City officials from Belton and Morgan's Point have been invited to attend the event as well.

TABA invites all who are interested to make plans to attend this important seminar.

We had numerous shooters at the event last year that could impressively powder the clays and the smell of gun


powder in the air made me more than ready for hunting season.

Kristi Sutterfield, Executive Director of the Texas Association of Builders (TAB), recently received the 2006 Executive Officer of the Year Award from the Executive Officers Council (EOC) of the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB).

The EOC serves the more than 800 executives who manage NAHB's state and local home builders associations, primarily through professional development and association management education opportunities.

The Executive Officer of the Year Award, named for NAHB's former Chief Legal Counsel Gary Komarow, is presented annually to an executive officer whose accomplishments in association management have been extraordinary and who has gone over and beyond promoting the goals of the EOC, while assisting the advancement of fellow executive officers.

"The Texas Association of Builders is fortunate to have such a caring and dedicated Executive Director as Kristi Sutterfield," said Jerry Carter, President of the Texas Association of Builders. "She is tireless in her efforts to support the home building industry in Texas and we are pleased that NAHB has recognized her as the 2006 Executive Officer of the Year."

Sutterfield, who has been with the Texas Association of Builders since 2002, oversees the third largest statewide home builders association in the United States, with over 14,000 members and 31 local associations.

TABA members play an important and influential role in this community, and we want everyone to understand that our 350 plus members represent thousands of employees in our local area.

Though the presentation will only represent a sampling of our membership, it should provide folks with a reminder that TABA members are the people this community send their kids to school with, go to church with, play local sports with, sell their wares to, buy their homes from, receive professional advisement from, and often see regularly in similar venues on a day to day basis.
