Now For Home PAC

As I noted last month, the Reverse Raffle was our last fundraiser and moves us into <u>Home PAC</u> season. The one and only fundraiser for Home PAC is the Skeet Shoot that is coming up on Tuesday, September 9th. This all day shoot is another one of those don't miss events. What I'd like to spend a moment on is a question that seems to continue to surface. "What is the difference between TABA and Home PAC?" TABA is the local branch, so to speak, that operates under the state branch, the Texas Association of Builders (TAB), all of which is under the National Association of Builders (NAHB). We are the grassroots part of the homebuilding lobby that works with our local cities and county. When we pursue statewide issues, we work with the Texas Association of Builders. And of course, NAHB handles national issues in Washington.

Operating completely independently of TABA, with it's own board and bylaws is TABA Home PAC. Home PAC is the political action committee aligned with TABA, hence the last three letters in the name (PAC), which raises the money to support candidates, causes, and issues related to improving our ability to operate businesses in the homebuilding industry. Our local PAC is regulated by laws that limit the types of organizations we can accept money from and what types of candidates we can support--TABA Home PAC is not able to support any federal candidates. TABA is a non-profit organization that is prohibited from supporting any candidate period. So, if you are wondering why we are asking you to join both TABA and Home PAC, now you know why.

A portion of your membership dues paid to TABA go to TAB and NAHB. The fundraisers for TABA go directly to our operating budget, which enables us to consistently interact with our local governments and to provide networking opportunities for our members. Your Home PAC contributions go directly to the support of local pro-growth candidates and issues that are relevant to protecting and enhancing the homebuilding industry.

Hope this helps shed a little light on the difference between TABA and Home PAC. If you are not currently a member of Home PAC, please contact Troy about a membership.

2008 NEC Could Increase Housing Costs

September 1st will bring about some significant changes for builders who are planning projects outside city limits. Not only will they be dealing with the new <u>TRCC 3rd Party Inspection</u> requirements, rural builders will also be dealing with additional requirements that will come about as a result of the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulations adoption of 2008 National Electric Code installation requirements.

In effort to make sure our builders know everything that they can about this code change, TABA will host a <u>City of</u> <u>Temple Construction Safety Department</u> sponsored seminar to help you prepare. Please reserve the morning of Wednesday, August 20th to familiarize yourself with NEC 2008. For more information, please see our <u>online flyer</u>.

Those who build inside the city limits should plan to attend this event as well. It is very likely that most municipalities will adopt some version of the 2008 NEC by January 2009.

Significant and costly changes will include:

*GFCI Protection Requirements for Receptacles in Dwelling Unit Garages

- *Combination-type AFCI-protective Devices
- *Equipment Grounding Conductors Supplying Separate Structures
- *NM Cables (Romex) in Attics
- *Tamper Resistant Receptacles in Dwelling Units.

County Inspections Workshop

TABA has asked <u>Stephen Polozola</u>, construction attorney with Decker Jones, to provide a workshop briefing about the upcoming TRCC rules for building outside a municipality. As you likely know, any house not contracted or permitted for construction outside a municipality will be subject to inspections after September 1, 2008. Three inspections are required (foundation, framing/mechanical, final). To find an inspector <u>click here</u>. Storm Water Self-Certified

You shouldn't have to look far to figure out that your association is hard at work advocating for you on all levels of government. Whether it be monitoring and participating in activities of local government, providing education on new regulations close to home, achieving economic assistance in Washington D.C., or promoting more user-friendly compliance practices, your association is at work for you. A great example of this is what has recently been achieved by a <u>collaboration involving the Texas Association of Builders (TAB), the EPA, and TCEQ</u>.

As noted on the TAB website, "Beginning in late fall 2008, builder members of the Texas Association of Builders may choose to complete a "Self-Assessment Checklist" for each of their Notices of Intent. For each fully completed checklist, the builder will receive on "Storm Water Self-Certified" sticker to place on the corresponding permit. Sites that display the certification sticker will be a lower priority for routine inspections."

Area 6 (which includes Temple) Vice President Steve Sorrells, who led the charge on this effort, said of the new practice that "the Texas Association of Builders is looking forward to continuing our work with EPA and TCEQ to provide education to builders to further reduce storm water runoff and protect the environment. Our past collaborations and this agreement demonstrate that trade associations, regulatory agencies and businesses can work successfully together toward achieving common goals."
