

Congratulations Mr. and Mrs. Randy Hunka!!! Cheryl has tied the knot and we at TABA are very happy for her and husband Randy. Join me in congratulating Cheryl Hunka next time you see her.

The 2009 Belton Design Standards have been released for public review. They are available online at the <u>City of Belton website</u>. We have documented and submitted our initial comments to Belton leadership and will work with them as much as we can to protect the interests of the building industry in Belton. In a nutshell, those interests reflect the TABA mission, which is to "Promote and Enhance Home Ownership." We believe the interests of homebuyers at all price points should be protected in order to assure that the opportunity to own a home is available to as many people that are willing to work for it. The next scheduled workshop on the topic is April 7<sup>th</sup>.

TABA has continued to work on issues regarding the recently adopted **Temple Irrigation Ordinance**. From the beginning we've advocated for protecting our drinking water with an approach that would do the least to drive up the the cost of irrigation systems and limit their effectiveness. The additional cost of a mandatory back flow preventer called a Reduced Pressure Zone valve quickly drove up the price of existing and new irrigation systems that were being installed or repaired throughout the city. Due to a variety of complaints we received about this issue TABA spent some time in search of a low cost solution. Consulting with an advisor to the TCEQ we found that there is an alternative device that serves the same purpose, lessens the drop in pressure that the mechanisms place on systems, and costs considerably less. With this information, TABA recommended the Pressure Vacuum Breaker to the City for consideration. We requested the City accept the PVB as an alternative high hazard check device and have recently been informed that the City of Temple is taking steps to get the ordinance back to Council to make the necessary change to the code. Thanks to all who played a role in this undertaking and to the City of Temple for their willingness to respond to our request.


Texas Senate Bill 16, by Waco Senator Kip Averitt, is one of the key pieces of legislation that TAB is tracking this session. A key component of the omnibus Energy bill would move all areas of the state to the 2009 Energy Code by September. The code is said to be 15 percent more stringent than the 2006 IECC (essentially the performance level required by Energy Star). The federal economic stimulus bill provides more than \$2 billion in incentive for states to fast-track its adoption and implementation. This could pose problems on the municipal level as well as the industry level because most cities have just recently adopted the 2006 Code and there is no performance software developed to date to support the recently published newer version of code. With this in mind, TAB is working hard to push the implementation date to 2011.

City of Temple Engineer Michael Newman recently wrote to inform us of the need for stakeholder meetings to address best

management practices concerning **Storm Water compliance** during construction and post-construction phases of development. These meetings are the next step requirements of the city's storm water compliance under the EPA/TCEQ Municipal Stormwater Program (MS4) regulations. Recall, TABA and many of our members have been involved in the process since it was introduced in 2007. The developer stakeholder meetings will take place on April 23<sup>rd</sup> from 10 to 12 and will serve as a refresher to what has already been established locally in regard to BMP's and allow us to begin moving toward the adoption of recommended practices for the City of Temple.

On Thursday, May 21<sup>st</sup> Boise Cascade will host a **free builder lunch at TABA** to discuss their second floor flooring systems. Builders and inspectors are invited to attend. Please add this to your calendar, we hope to see you there.
