TABA Member Provides Head's Up on New Irrigation Standards...


Dean Winkler of CRW Construction wrote to inform us of the negative impact the recently adopted City of Temple Irrigation Code had to his bottom line after he completed a commercial renovation. During the project, he opened a main irrigation line to the atmosphere, triggering what is determined to be a major renovation to a lawn system. For this the code inspector required him to bring the existing back flow device up to the new Code standards (ie: Reduced Pressure Zone). The cost of the additional equipment was \$800. Dean further cautioned that the RPZ creates a water pressure loss of 10 to 12 pounds, and can effectively negate the effectiveness of previously marginal systems. Fixing this problem can further add to the cost of a system. Please check out our presentations page to view Dean's letter.
