Green Build Course at TABA This Month

TABA has set the date for "Green is Mainstream." The course will be held on Thursday, April 29th from 10am to 1pm and will cost \$45 for members, with lunch included. The course offering is related to energy efficiency in homes. The workshop is designed to educate the residential construction community on coming changes to the Texas Building Code and Energy Performance Standards as they relate to the 2009 version of the IRC--this in giving you and idea about what to prepare as the State Energy Conservation Office is moving toward statewide adoption of the code. It will also include general information on the national green building program certifications that are available for residential construction as well as best practices for installation of energy efficient products.

OSHA On the Prowl

OSHA has been making the rounds in Central Texas lately. They are said to be inspecting and fining at construction sites in McLennan County and telling builders that they are back in the regulatory business. In response, we've been making our members aware and pointing them in the direction of a 10 hour course that is being offered locally at Temple College on "Construction Safety Training." 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
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15 HOMES ON TOUR THIS YEAR


