Federal Fines to Increase on August 1

On Aug. 1, monetary penalties issued by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) for regulation infractions are slated to rise by up to 150% depending on the type of violation.

This marks the first time in 25 years that OSHA fines have gone up. Previously, OSHA was one of few federal agencies with civil penalties that do not increase with inflation.

Last November, President Obama signed into law the <u>Inflation Adjustment Act</u> to ensure federal agencies regularly update the monetary levels of civil penalties to keep pace with inflation. The act required these agencies to raise their penalties by Aug. 1 based on guidance issued by the White House Office of Management and Budget, which looked at inflation rates and other factors affecting costs before advising the agencies.

But OSHA is not the only federal agency that plans to up its fines. Builders need to pay even closer attention to how they're following the letter of the law. Here's two more examples:

- The Environmental Protection Agency's maximum civil penalty for violating the Clean Water Act's stormwater permitting requirements will increase to a maximum of \$51,570 per violation from a prior maximum civil penalty of \$37,500 per violation – an increase of nearly 40%.
- Meanwhile, the Fish and Wildlife Service has set its maximum civil penalty for violating the Endangered Species Act's "take" prohibition increases from \$25,000 to \$49,467 per violation: an increase of 98%.

Make sure to take advantage of the compliance materials NAHB maintains for its members on regulations as diverse as <u>silica</u>, <u>lead paint</u> and <u>stormwater</u>. If you do not have a construction safety plan or program, the Texas Association of Builders offers a <u>Model Construction Safety Program and Jobsite Safety Standards</u> <u>Package</u> that provides you with comprehensive guidelines to help you train your employees regarding their responsibilities and to help you establish good safety procedures and systems for recordkeeping required by OSHA.

It's True: We Want to Own a Home

An overwhelming 4 of 5 Americans believe that owning a home is a good investment, according to a <u>recent</u> <u>poll</u> that NAHB commissioned to gauge public sentiment on the value of homeownership and government programs that encourage homeownership and housing production.

Polling firm Morning Consult conducted the nationwide survey of more than 2,800 registered voters in July. "The survey shows that most Americans believe that owning a home remains an integral part of the American Dream and that policymakers need to take active steps to encourage and protect homeownership," said NAHB Chairman Ed Brady. Among the key findings:

- 82% rate "a home for you to live in" a good or excellent investment (the highest of six choices) and far ahead of the second option, retirement accounts, at 67%.
- 81% of 18-to 29-year-olds want to buy a home.
- 72% support the government providing tax incentives to encourage homeownership.
- 46% say now is a good time to buy a home, twice the 23% who say it is not.
- 36% would like to buy a home in the next three years.

Among those polled, 55% said the biggest obstacle to buying a home was finding a home at a price they can afford, followed by 50% who cited insufficient savings for a down payment and 41% who reported difficulty getting approved for a home loan. The survey was evenly split on which presidential candidate would be best for housing. Thirty-eight percent of the respondents cited Hillary Clinton, 37% Donald Trump, and 25% reported "don't know" or "no opinion."

OSHA Anti-Retaliation Enforcement Provision Delayed

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) has decided to postpone the effective enforcement date for the anti-retaliation provisions in its <u>new recordkeeping rule</u>.

Originally slated to start Aug. 10, the provision would require employers to inform workers of their rights to report work-related injuries and illnesses without fear of retaliation, and to implement procedures for reporting

White House Heeds Call for Thorough Review of EPA Stormwater Proposal

Good news for builders who want increased scrutiny of the changes being made to the Environmental Protection Agency's existing <u>2012 Construction General Permit</u> (CGP):

EPA officials recently confirmed they will submit the agency's 2017 <u>CGP</u> to the White House Office of Management and Budget (OMB) for review this fall. OMB's review will examine the potential impact of EPA's proposal and provide NAHB with the opportunity to discuss the cost to small businesses of implementing the changes.

Once approved, the 2017 CGP will remain in effect for five years.

A major worry: The draft CGP requires home builders to make their individual stormwater pollution prevention plans (SWPPPs) publicly available. Posting these large, complex documents online poses many concerns, from privacy issues to whether government sites could effectively handle and screen such massive amounts of new data.

EPA also requested input on requiring "joint" SWPPPs for operators in the same common plan of development, as well as stricter inspection and stabilization timelines (reduced from 14 to seven days).

EPA now requires builders to pull a permit for discharges from any construction activity disturbing more than one acre, or if they are building on less than one acre in a larger subdivision.

In addition to serving as model language for most state programs, the CGP applies in states where EPA is the direct permitting authority: New Mexico, Idaho, New Hampshire and Massachusetts.

NAHB Calls on Trump and Clinton to Focus on Housing

NAHB Chairman Ed Brady today called on Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump and presumptive Democratic presidential nominee Hillary Clinton to make housing a priority during this election season.

<u>Appearing in a live segment on CNBC's</u> "Closing Bell" on the floor of the Republican National Convention in Cleveland, Brady said: "We're here to support housing. We're bipartisan. We know housing is an important part of the economy. We want to make sure whoever wins [the election in November] that housing becomes a national priority."

Brady added that NAHB has discussed housing finance reform and other issues that are important to the industry
with both the Trump and Clinton campaigns and that the NAHB leadership will also be attending the Democratic
National Convention in Philadelphia later this month.
