

# EXECUTIVE OFFICER UPDATE

I am excited to introduce myself as your new Executive Officer. I began serving in this role in February 2024 and am honored to be here. I have had the pleasure of meeting many of you at our past events, and I eagerly look forward to meeting and connecting with those I have yet to meet in person.

Let me share a little about my background. I am a United States Marine Corps Veteran who served at MCB Twentynine Palms and MCB Camp Pendleton, where I was a ground electronics technician. During my time enlisted, I worked my way up to becoming a Training & Development Manager and then an Operations Manager. While serving, I earned my Associate of Arts from Central Texas College and my Bachelor of Science in Business Management from Park University.

I continued my education after leaving the military and earned a Master of Business Administration in Project Management from Park University. My experiences in the military and my chosen degree path sparked a passion for the building industry.

After completing my service, my family and I moved back home to Texas. Although I was born in College Station, I grew up in the Dallas area and decided to settle down in Temple over three years ago. Since then, I have been working in the industry as a Warranty Manager, where I focused on managing the homebuilder's warranty department. During that time, I was also involved in the field with the superintendents and subcontractors, which allowed me to learn more about the construction process and work with all of our homeowners. Additionally, I created an OSHA-compliant Safety and Health program for the company to ensure the safety of our employees and homeowners.

For the past two years, I have actively served on every committee for TABA and was awarded "2023 Committee Member of the Year". Outside of the industry, I am part of the Leadership Temple Class of 2024 and the recently accepted Leadership Central Texas Class of 2024. I was also appointed to the City of Temple's Building & Standards Commission as an Alternate for District 4.

I am passionate about our industry and community and believe that together we can achieve great things. I hope to see you all at our upcoming events this year.





I have spent the last two decades of my life engaged in the political process in some form, from a volunteer to a campaign manager, and from a Party Delegate to a City Councilmember, but these last few months with you all have been some of the most fulfilling. Below is a synopsis of a few issues we've been tackling, what we're doing to continue improving the building climate in Bell County, and how you can get engaged:

#### **Bell County Subdivision Regulations**

For the last few months, we led a coalition with the Central Texas Homebuilders Association, Temple-Belton Board of Realtors, and Fort Hood Area Association of Realtors to draft a response to several changes to the County's sub-division regulations. On Monday 4/29 we were successful in combatting these changes and championing several great reforms.

#### **City of Temple Sewer Tap Fees**

Early this year the City of Temple began implementing a new Sewer Tap fee on new construction without any communication or warning. Due to our relationship with their leadership, we were able to achieve a moratorium on the fees and are working to have this brought before the City Council for review and refunds for the ones that were erroneously assessed prior.

#### Theft of Property

Several of our members have noticed an increase in theft of property incidents across the region. We met with the Temple Police Chief and were offered a variety of solutions. We'll be scheduling a Lunch-and-Learn with Chief Reynolds in the near future so he can further explain what his department can do to assist us, and likewise how we can help them in potentially solving more of these cases.

Supplemental to the work of the Government affairs Committee, The TABA HomePAC has been hard at work assisting candidates who support our industry and have Bell Counties best interest at Heart. For those unfamiliar with The HomePAC, this is a separate entity from TABA and exists to advocate and support for pro-housing policies and candidates. The work HomePAC does is vital to TABA's continued success, and I sincerely thank every one of our donors and supporters. These donations allow us to provide monetary and in-kind assistance to candidates, things that TABA cannot engage in due to our non-profit status.

In the March Primary we supported Mike Russell in his bid for the 146th District court judgeship, and he won overwhelmingly. He is unopposed in the November General Election and takes office next January.



This year the HomePAC Board voted to take a stand in several municipal races. These races are the closest to you as a taxpayer and historically decided by only a handful of votes. These candidates are both Pro-housing, Pro-workforce training, and Pro-Bell County. In the May 4th election, the TABA HomePAC has voted to support Chris Flor for Belton ISD Area 4 and Dr. Alejandro Arroliga for Temple College Board of Trustees.





Several races from the Primary did not have a candidate win a majority and will be going into a run-off on May 28th. Of those races HomePAC has decided to support **Greg Reynolds for County Commissioner-Precinct Three and Tim Taylor for Justice of the Peace-Precinct Three Place One.**Both of these candidates are trusted leaders in their respective fields, have been vetted by the HomePAC Board, and have solid understandings of our industry. I encourage you to support them in the May 28th Runoff, with early voting going from May 20th through 25th.
